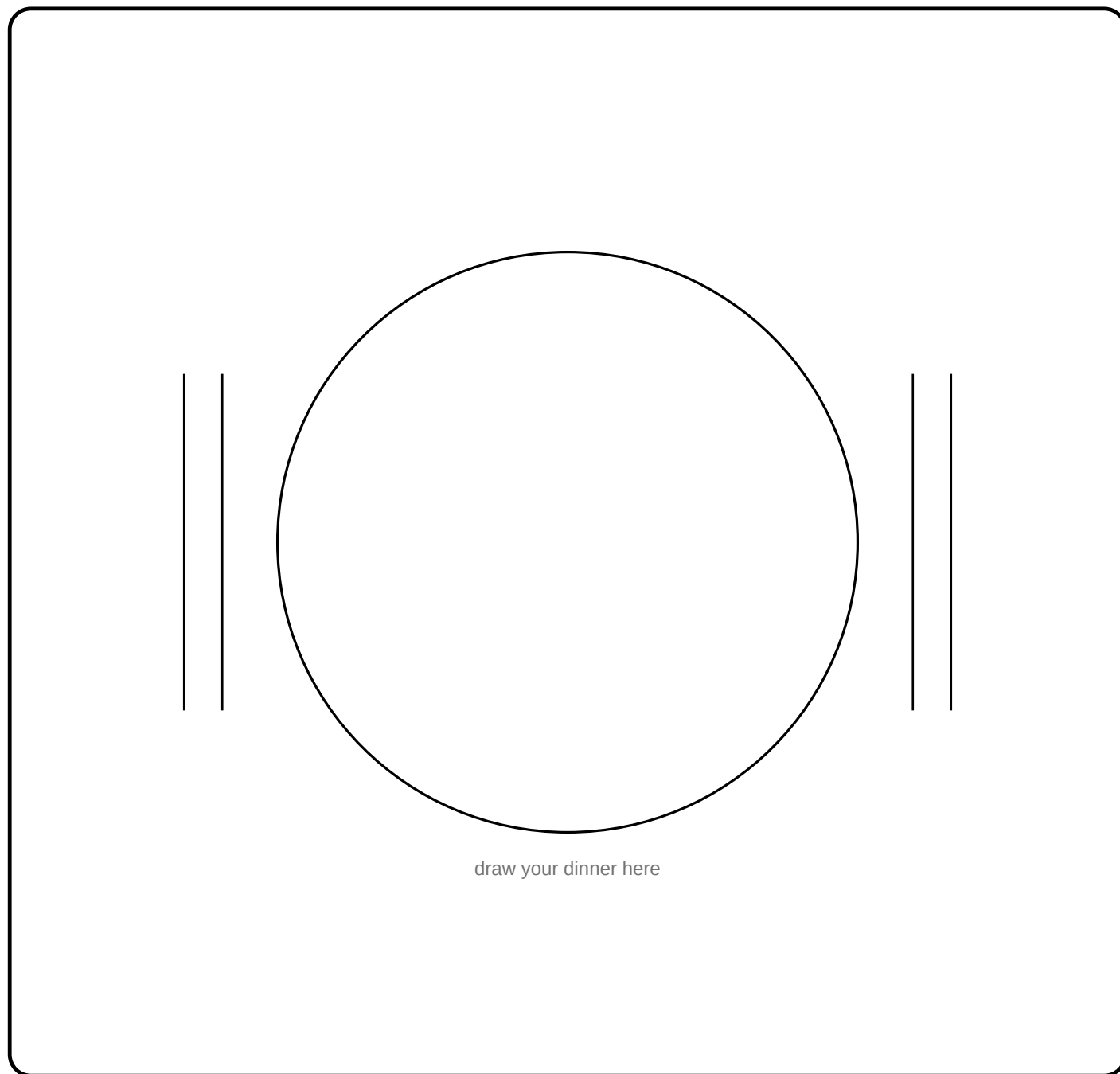

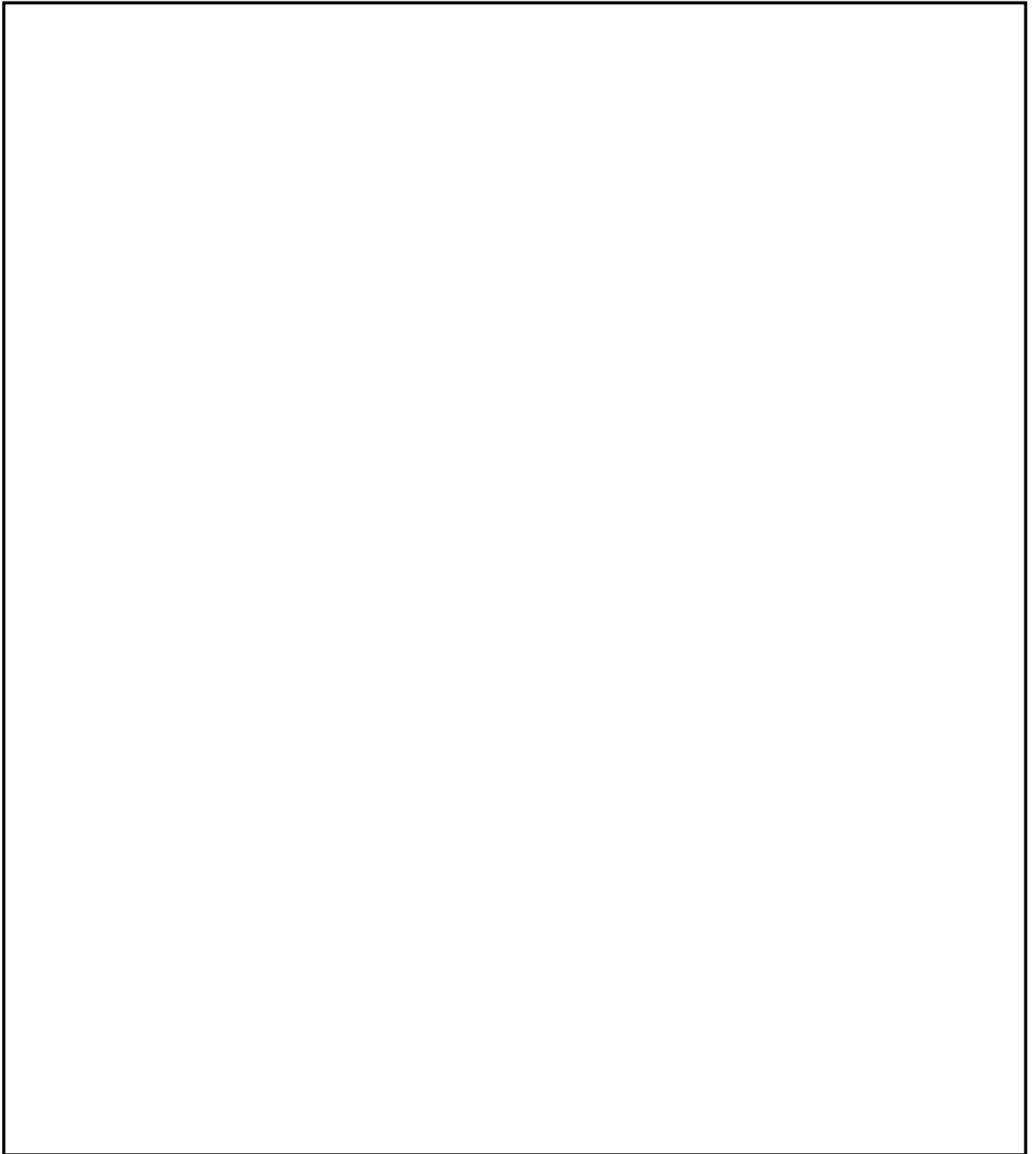

Grown-ups only.

Find the pairs — every word on the left has a match on the right except one. The odd one out is Window, on the right: there is no Window on the left-hand list. Candle on the left also has no partner, so a sharp kid will spot that there are two odd ones, not one. If they do, they are right and you should say so.
